I have some new blogs coming up this week. I write about the tower climber's #1 problem. I put this together because I thought the problem was safety, what a misconception. I learned it originally back at the TIRAP conference that it's really not safety, but money. Seriously, more tower climbers are worried about their jobs and getting paid than anything else. Contractors align with this as well as employees! Based on feedback and discussion in the industry, it goes like this:

- 1. Getting paid by employer or customer.
- 2. Getting expense money. Getting paid for Change Orders.
- 3. Where will I work next month?
- 4. Will I get fired/laid off if I say something?
- 5. Being away from home.
- 6. Safety!

WI-Fi Versus LTE-U: I also have some posts coming out about the Wi-Fi and LTE-U discussions. I brought this up because it is a hot topic in the industry. There is a battle between the carriers and the Wi-Fi people about whether LTE-U should be allowed in the unlicensed band. I heard on RCR TV Wi-Fi NOW that the battle rages on. The Wi-Fi people are angry because they are worried about LTE-U tramping on them. The CEO of Bandwidth, David Morken, mentions that he thinks that the Wi-Fi users should be allowed to run Wi-Fi in the licensed bands. While this is funny, they could have purchased some licensed bands and maybe the FCC would let them run Wi-Fi in that band. I would call that WiMAX, but hey, you need to purchase the bands first, like Clearwire did. I am just saying. Don't get me wrong, I love Wi-Fi, I think it's awesome. I also think that LTE-U will be really cool and I am hoping they can coexist together.

Does your company have a wireless strategy? Well who do they want to support? Do they want to partner with a carrier or build out their own system? Do they have any licenses that they can deploy?

Do they want to use Wi-Fi? Will they use LTE-U if the FCC approves of it? What is their target customer? All questions to help with the clarity.

When do we decommission 2G and 3G? I think that it's only a matter of time, but they have to go sometime. 3G is going to be the provider of voice and there are so many UE units on CDMA that I don't see it going anywhere for 3 years or so. However, why is 2G still out there? What's up with that? If there is still 2G out there it should be removed in my opinion, at least in North America! Let's move ahead. AT&T set a date to remove 2G by 2017. They still have subscribers on 2G and let me tell you, no one wants to give up their old phones if they work. They don't want to go to a high priced data plan if they don't need it! If 2G will be live until 2017, then 3G will probably be alive until 2020, when 5G is going to be introduced as more than a good idea but as an actual product.
